David Wilbur is a pathologist internationally respected for his work in both cervical and non-gynae cytopathology. In addition, he has a major interest in digital pathology.



Prior to retirement from clinical practice in 2019 he was Director of Cytopathology and Clinical Imaging at the Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. He remains a Professor of Pathology Emeritus at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Wilbur continues to be active in teaching and research. He is currently Chief Scientist for Corista, LLC, a digital pathology software company where his work in machine learning in digital pathology continues. He is the co-editor of the most recent *Bethesda System for Reporting Cervical Cytology*, *The College of American Pathologists' Practical Guide to Gynecologic Cytopathology*, and the 3rd and 4th editions of the major textbook *Comprehensive Cytopathology*.
